

Chapter One



LOVE & LIGHT

Love and Light. What do they have in common? They are the basis of life. Without light, life as we know it could not exist. Without love, life as we know it would be intolerable. We all need light to survive, and we all need love to survive. A loveless, lightless life is no life at all.

There is another major similarity between love and light. They can both be reduced to numbers. Strange isn't it? But it's true. Remember Pythagoras? He was the famous mathematician, scientist and philosopher who lived approximately 2500 hundred years ago (500 years BCE, before the Common/Christian Era). Aside from being credited with the discovery of the Pythagorean Theorem relating to the hypotenuse of a right triangle, which we learned in geometry class ($a^2 + b^2 = c^2$), he made this astute observation:

Numbers rule the universe. Everything is arranged according to number and mathematical shape.

This is a powerful statement, but how can this be so, that numbers rule the universe? Answer: because everything can be translated and/or reduced into some form of numerical design. Take computers for example. They are totally based in numbers, basically 0s and 1s. In fact, all science, commerce, banking, colors, music, light and sound have numbers at their core. Light, which is basically electromagnetic radiation, can be measured using numbers. Sound, which is simply mechanical vibration, can also be measured using numbers. Interestingly, and quite profoundly, love and attraction between people can also be measured and described using numbers! The purpose of this book is to reveal the numeric keys and codes of love and attraction so you can apply their truth to your life and thereby increase your own personal happiness and fulfillment.

Both light and love are energy. As human beings, each of us and our destinies are energy too, and that energy can be translated into numbers, just like light and sound. When we learn the simple process of reading our own set of personal numbers, as well as those numbers of the people we love or with whom we are associated, we can create a readable numerical configuration, format, structure or outline of love, a *loveline* so to speak. Once learned, the process of knowing someone via their numbers can be done in as little as five minutes!

When the numbers (energies) between people mix extremely well in their combined or mixed *loveline*, there is the wonderful feeling of attraction, harmony, joy and love. When the numbers between people are discordant and clash, there is detraction, repulsion, discord and little to no love. Therefore, in finding love the key is to find someone whose personal numbers blend

extremely well with our own. To reiterate this reality, when the numbers between two people are highly concordant and complementary, there is attraction and love. When the numbers between two people are highly discordant and non-complementary, there is little to no attraction or love. It's as simple as that.

So what are these numbers in our personal *loveline*, how do we find them and what are the secrets to creating an harmonious and fulfilling match using them? That's what this book will address and teach. The process is not hard. In fact, it's very easy, so just because we're going to use numbers, don't panic if you're not number savvy. You don't have to be. All you have to do is be able to add a few numbers together and associate those numbers with their attributes and characteristics, which we'll explain in due time and which a grade school student can understand. This is not only very simple, it's also easy and fun and, most importantly, can help you know who the best spouse, friends and associates will be in your life. When relationships are based on our personal numbers - the intrinsic labels of our personal energy fields, we and those whom we love, will enjoy much more fulfilling and meaningful relationships. Our lives will then be joyful, happy and beautiful.

Benefits

Before we begin learning the numerical design of the loveline, let's discuss the benefits of using numbers as one aspect of generating good relationships. As a pre-note, this process is based on *The King's Numerology* system which has been developed over decades of study, research and application in the

realm of relationships. It is real and it works. It may be unconventional and on the fringe of accepted thought but that is because it is unconventional and on the edge of what is considered normal, at least for the time being. It is also because using numbers as a method of assessing relationships is a new idea. Yet, once the process has been studied, applied and proven, its acceptance will become universal and the whole experience of love between people will no longer be a mystery, but a commonly known and actualized reality.

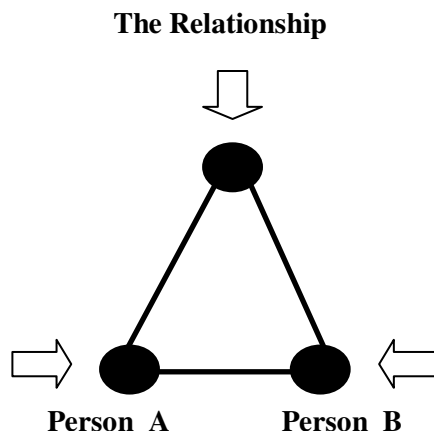
1. Self-Awareness

In establishing our own numeric profile or *Basic Matrix* (*The King's Book of Numerology, Volume I: Foundations & Fundamentals*), we will begin to know ourselves, our needs, wants, desires, personality, purpose, strengths, weaknesses, challenges and path in life. In effect, we will adhere to the ancient Greek admonition, "Know Thyself." If we don't know who we are and what we want, how can we be happy? Each of us does have a God-given right to be happy and fulfilled. If our cup is empty, how can it overflow to help fill someone else's cup? It can't. Therefore, it is not meant that individually we should totally sacrifice ourselves for someone else at the expense of our own well-being. Each of us has a right to our own life. After all, our lives are indeed that, our lives, and we are responsible for them. No one is responsible for us but us. Therefore, to be happy we must do for us to a degree, not to a point of self-absorption and self-centeredness, but to a point of health and wholeness. Think of a new seedling. If it gave away to other seedlings the nutrients in the soil it needed to grow, how could it grow, let alone flourish and create more seed

and fruit that could be subsequently shared with others? The fact is, it couldn't. It would die, and dying with it in the process would be a future of potential abundance for all to share. Tragic.

2. Knowing the Other Person

If we're involved in a relationship - whether it is romantic, domestic, social or business-oriented, and we only know or care about who we are and what we want and have no concern for who the other person is, what their needs, wants and desires are, what good is that? It is no good at all. The key to successful relationships is not only knowing what we need but equally knowing what the other person needs and then having each of the partners surrender themselves to the relationship, which is a living entity in itself.



It's obvious that if either or both of the individuals are too consumed with themselves and their own needs, wants and desires to the exclusion of the relationship, the triangle will be broken and the relationship will suffer, if not totally collapse. The moral of

this little diagram is that all successful relationships in which both or all participants are happy, fulfilled and content are built on a desire to keep the relationship triangle complete. Therefore, each person must be dedicated to making the appropriate sacrifices for the health of the entity that is the relationship, an entity that is built on balance between the partners, i.e., the pillars creating it.

3. Raising of Children

A third benefit is the raising of children. When parents know exactly what their children need, what motivates them, where their lives are taking them and what role they will ultimately give on the great life stage, they can be a wonderful asset in their children's lives. But if they do not truly know nor understand what their children need, regardless of the most loving intent in the world, they may actually be damaging their children. This was illustrated in the mother/son relationship mentioned in the author's introduction.

Raising children is not just about patting them on the back, hugging them, complimenting them, feeding them, clothing them, disciplining them and housing them. It is just as much about guiding them and helping them grow into their own selves and lives, not the selves and lives the parents may want for their children based on their (the parent's) own needs, wants and desires but the children's. Every individual has his own destiny, own personality, character traits, assets, liabilities, strengths and weaknesses and these may be totally incongruent with those of the parents, for good or bad. Yet, how often do parents, in attempting to raise their children, not truly understand what their children need in the deepest sense.

4. Personal Balance

Another major benefit of knowing how numbers work in people's lives is that we learn to honor who we are and not become consumed and imbalanced by attempting to be like someone else, which can never happen anyway. It's fine to emulate the good qualities of another person, but each of us has our own distinct, separate, specific and personal destiny that God gave us. In other words, each of us is uniquely special, a truth that needs to be honored and embraced rather than foregone in lieu of trying to be someone whom we are not. Getting caught up in celebrity worship, as one example, is betraying our own divine blueprint. Why go from cradle to grave consumed with worshipping, idolizing, copying or attempting to be someone else, all the while paying little or no attention to the beautifully divine and unique individual that each of us intrinsically is? By honoring our own life and respecting it rather than ignoring it by worshipping someone else and their life is one method of remaining balanced and content in life. Where there is contentment, there is peace. As Shakespeare poignantly states in *Hamlet*, Act I, Scene iii:

*This above all, to thine own self be true and it must follow as
the night the day, thou canst not then be false to any man.*

5. Sharing the Wisdom

Once we understand by direct experience the truth of numbers as they relate to our lives, we can share such truth with others and by so doing help them understand their lives and increase their happiness and well-being. Once we know, we can

never not know. Certainly, knowing is better than not knowing. When we don't know, how can we possibly change or improve our position or relationships? We can't. Yet, when we know, we have power, the power to adjust and work with our destiny and not fight, deprecate or depreciate it in any way but rather be grateful to God that He gave us the opportunity to live, grow, evolve and climb higher on the ladder of life.

Examples

To understand the power of knowing numbers, their relationship to life, and how we can learn from them, let's take a brief look at a few examples of real people, their lives and relationships. The names of the people involved have been changed but the scenarios are all real, taken from The King's Numerology archives.

Example #1: Parent/Child Opposition

This is the example discussed in the introduction. Basically, Jenny was a wonderful, caring and loving mother who had the number 8 [eight] dominate in her numerology chart. Eight [8] is the number of social power and interaction. It is the most external of the basic numbers One [1] through Nine [9] - the *Alpha-Numeric Spectrum* or *Avenue of Crowns*. Her son Jon had the number 7 [seven] dominate in the desire component of his chart. Seven [7] is the most internal of the basic numbers. Seven loves its seclusion, privacy and solitude - all things Jon loved and required for his own well-being.

From the time Jon was born, Jenny encouraged her son to be social because this was her numeric point of reference, although

she wasn't versed in numerology and its application to life. As Jon grew, it was obvious he was reclusive. Jenny perceived this to be a problem and kept urging him to be more communicative and social. Tensions grew. Jon's confidence was stifled, his self-image negatively charged.

The problem in this case is that the numbers 7 and 8 are direct opposites. They conflict. Jon's most intimate desires in life were to be reclusive, to be his own best company, to embrace the solitude he loved and needed for his own well-being, to withdraw from social events, not embrace them.

Frankly, there was nothing wrong with Jon at all. Seven energy is not a social energy. Eight is. Had Jenny understood numbers and their relationship to life, the problems and personal esteem issues of her son could have been avoided from birth by having her embrace his need for solitude rather than urging him to be social. This entire experience lasted for sixteen years until Jenny sat in on Jon's numerology reading. It was then she discovered the true needs of her son and her mistake in flooding him with her expectations. After she gained an understanding of her son's needs, she instantly made the corrections, being deeply apologetic to her son for her actions in raising him.

In fairness to Jenny, this parent/child opposition is quite normal. Many teachers are also guilty of the same mistake. There is a belief that being social is normal and that people who are not social are abnormal. Hence, the action of parents and teachers to keep encouraging the children under their care to be social. This is unfortunate and hopefully such misdirected insistence of sociability will change as people become more aware of numbers and how they affect life and destiny. This is not to say that

negative anti-social behavior is not problematic, but simply because someone prefers, in fact needs, to be alone is not in and of itself a problem.

Here's a quick reference note regarding numbers. Social energies are marked by the even numbers 2-4-6-8. The odd numbers 1-3-5-7-9 are generally considered creative numbers.

Social vs. Creative Numbers

The following number sets represent direct opposites. When these numbers appear in a chart or charts, they can create opposition, conflict, confusion.

Numerical Opposites

1 vs. 2
4 vs. 5
7 vs. 8

One rules the self, male and fire; Two rules others, the female and water. Four governs convention and stability; Five is the energy of non-convention and movement. Seven, as noted, rules all things internal; Eight, all things external.

Example #2: Spontaneity vs. Practicality

Alice and Anthony were girlfriend and boyfriend. Alice had a great deal of 4 energy in her chart while Anthony's chart was rich in 5 energy. As we see from the "Numerical Opposites" exhibit above, the numbers 4 and 5 are opposites. Four [4] is practical,

traditional, conventional and deliberate. Its element is earth. Symbols for the 4 would be an anchor, roots, chains, even the Rock of Gibraltar. The number Five [5], whose element is fire, is adventurous, non-traditional, unconventional and spontaneous. Five is the energy of diversity, movement and freedom. Symbols for the 5 include wings, wheels and the amorphous element mercury.

One evening, Anthony suggested to his girlfriend that they drive to a theme park a few hours away, sleep in the car and be ready to hit the fun as soon as the gates to the park opened the next morning. As far as Anthony was concerned, he was just reflecting his spontaneous and adventurous 5 self. Alice, however, didn't see things the same way. For her, traveling a couple hours to a theme park, sleeping in a car, and hitting the rides at the amusement park at the break of dawn was not at all practical or adventurous. Was there a problem here? Yep. Wings and roots are not compatible. The result is that they didn't go on Anthony's little adventure. Ultimately, their relationship dissolved, each moving on to find a partner more compatible with their individual interests and energies.

Example #3: Star vs. Servant

Toni was a musician. His dream was to be a rock star. He had a band and worked at his craft. Yet, his dreams weren't being realized and he was frustrated. Eventually, he realized his dream wasn't going to materialize and he turned his energies to being a music producer rather than a rock star. His numbers clearly indicated this condition. His birth name was a One [1], the energy of the self, the star, the independent person and creator. This 1

energy was motivating him to be a rock star. However, the numbers from his birth date were a Two [2], the energy of support and helping others. The numbers of the birth date create what is called the *Lifepath* which is the major component creating the destiny. Although Toni wanted to be the star, the one who is the center of attention, his Lifepath placed him in a role of service, support and helping others rather than being a rock star in the limelight. Thus, Toni became a music producer.
