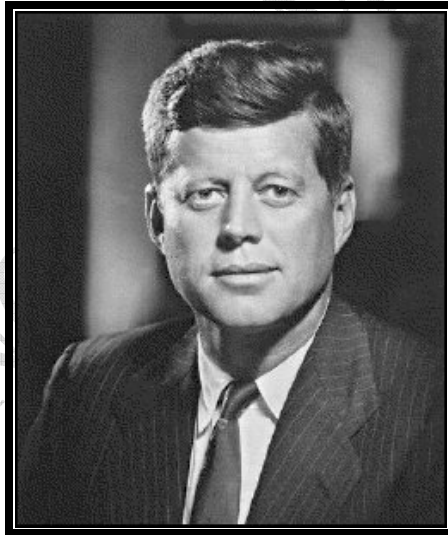

He was young, rich, dynamic and charismatic—a modern day iconic King of Camelot whose tragic death would befit a Shakespearean drama and leave a legacy of hidden adulterous affairs and a conspiracy of assassination that, unlike him, would never die. He was the youngest man ever elected to the Presidency of the United States of America at the age of forty-three. America's 35th Commander-in-Chief, he was John Fitzgerald Kennedy, notably known by his initials, JFK.

Kennedy's Presidency was saturated with tumult, marked by such events as the construction of the Berlin Wall by the USSR (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) in 1961, the bungled Bay of Pigs Invasion (also in 1961), the Cuban Missile Crisis (1962), the Space Race between America and the Soviet Union (which began in 1957 with the launching of Sputnik by the USSR), the on-going American Civil Rights Movement and the incipient stages of the Vietnam War. Perhaps the most horrendous event was his conspiracy-laden assassination on 22 November 1963 in Dealey Plaza, Dallas, Texas, at the age of 46— an event that shocked America and changed a nation forever.

John Fitzgerald Kennedy, also known personally as "Jack," was born on 29 May 1917. He served as President of the United States from his inauguration on 20 January 1961 (age 43) to his assassination on 22 November 1963 (age 46), a total of exactly 1037 days. Hence, his time in office is often referred to as the 1,000 Day Presidency. For such a relatively short time it was one of the most intense and problem-strewn White House occupancies ever, not simply on a national and international level but also on a personal basis. With such a presidential experience, what are some of the provocative questions that can be asked relative to his King's Numerology[™] chart?

JFK – BASIC MATRIX

The first clues to Kennedy's life are seen in his Basic Matrix.

Kennedy's ambition and attraction to public life is clearly visible in his 99-9 Material Soul, defining a desire to be a man of power, to move upon the universal life stage and be in the public eye. The ambition of power and rulership is at its zenith in the 99-9 master energy. Therefore, Kennedy loved being in a

power position and truth be told—he most probably loved being President of the United States of America, the most powerful office in the world, and thus arguably making him the most powerful man in the world.

Softening the potentially harsh aspects of the 99-9 is the personal love energy of Kennedy's 6 Nature and 33-6 PE which, although sexually charged (more on this later), reference the family—whether that family is a small unit of a few individuals, a community or a nation. Certainly, Kennedy was very popular with a vast number of Americans and this 6 energy was a major factor in people's love and admiration for him.

JFK's Lifepath is a 7—the most inherently tragic, turbulent, sorrowful, tearful, heartbreaking, heart wrenching and secretive of the nine basic life scripts. It is a very difficult Lifepath. Ironically, it is also the one containing the most spiritual energy and opportunity for substantive growth. Diamonds are made under extreme heat and pressure over an extended period of time, not by a mere and casual blowing of an intermittent wind. If a soul is to rise to the crystalline brilliance and strength of a diamond, it must be subjected to heat, pressure and time. It is the reality of life. As Winston Churchill beautifully stated, *Kites rise highest against the wind, not with it.*

Therefore, from the get-go it was obvious Kennedy's destiny would place him in difficult and challenging positions, both publically and personally, positions which would test his spirituality, nobility, character, ethics and morality. It was this 7 Lifepath that housed the tumultuous framework of his professional life, personal tragedies and presidential challenges.

Kennedy's Expression is an 8, the number of administration, organization, orchestration, coordination and connection—the exact energy necessary for an executive. This served him well as a public servant, especially given his 99-9 Material Soul and 22-4 Material Nature of service to the public.

The 11-2 Soul identifies a desire for relationship, partnership, competition, opposition, adversarial involvement and Yin (female) energy. This, unquestionably, was a factor in Kennedy's involvement with others. He embraced relationship, whether it was pleasant or adversarial. The master 22-4 Material Nature reveals a personality focused on structure, order, wealth and security. It is conventional, traditional, work and service-oriented—an excellent energy to have as a leader.

KENNEDY'S UNIQUENESS

Jack Kennedy was unique. No doubt about it. He was a true original, trend setter and leader. Which master number reflects these qualities? If you answered the 55-1, you're right. JFK's 55-1 master energy occupied his Crown Pinnacle PE (see Life Matrix), the same location as that of Howard Hughes. The

difference is that Kennedy's 55-1 PE stems from the 2 energy of others and relationship while Hughes' PE originated from the 3 energy of communication, image and media. Therefore, JFK's leadership and uniqueness is a derivative of *relationship* (in all its aspects—harmonious and contentious) and *others* (friend or foe) while Hughes' 55-1 emanated from the 3 energy of self-expression, art, media, image, well-being, pleasure and communication.

THE KENNEDY-WASHINGTON CONNECTION

There are some notable connections between John F. Kennedy, the 35th President of the United States, and George Washington, the 1st President in America's history. This would be expected of individuals who share powerful presidential legacies.

The 88 Master Number

The name "George Washington" is an 88-7. Kennedy's Name Timeline of "Fitzgerald" carries an 88 PE (NTL chart). As we know, 8 reflects administration, connection and organization—in effect, the *flow* of energy. As a master number, the 88-7 houses both powerfully positive and negative aspects. It can be very noble and spiritual or ignoble and worldly. The thing of note is that it is an extremely connective and interactive energy, whether its connections are divine or demonic. No number is more connective than the 8. It knows how to orchestrate, coordinate and get things done. This is why people with 8s in their charts often make very good managers, administrators, executives, personal assistants, mechanics—anyone who can understand the interrelationship and flow of a process from inception to completion. Other famous or infamous individuals with the number 88 in their charts are: Albert Einstein, Albert Schweitzer, Nikola Tesla, Mother Teresa, Elvis Presley, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, John Wooden, Michael Phelps, the United States of America, Warren Buffett, Joseph Stalin, Jared Lee Loughner and John Edwards.

JFK's 2nd Name Timeline of "Fitzgerald" was the period of his presidency and assassination. The 9/7 IR set with its underlying 88 master root threatened trouble and tragedy which, unfortunately, came to pass.

The 1/9 and 9/1 Juxtaposition

Another interesting connection between George Washington and John Kennedy are the 1/9 and 9/1 IR sets which reference leadership (1) of the public (9). Both of Washington's and JFK's charts reveal this 1-9 numerical combination during the exact time of their presidencies.

Washington served as president from age 57 to 65 (30 April 1789 to 4 March 1797). This was primarily during his 9/1 Letter Timeline (LTL) of the "I" in "Washington" from age 55 to 63. Kennedy served as president from age 43 to 46 (20 January 1961 to 22 November 1963) during his Grand Challenge timeline which housed a 1/9 IR set—the only timeline in his chart which revealed this 1/9 pattern.

The difference between the 1/9 and 9/1 is the numeric filter which colors the outcome. For example, Kennedy's Grand Challenge 1/9 IR set is derived from the 1 of the self, action and leadership passing through his 8 Expression to create the 9 ($1 + 8 = 9$). His 1/9 IR set could therefore be written as $1/(8)/9$.

Washington's Letter Timeline 9/1 IR set is derived from the initiating and influencing power of the 9 passing through his 1 Lifepath ($9 + 1 = 10$; $1 + 0 = 1$). Therefore, his 9/1 could be ciphered as $9/(1)/1$. Thus, the difference between the 1/9 and 9/1 is the number which acts as the filter or funnel through which the initiating *influence* number must pass to create the outcome *reality* number of the IR set. Still, both the 1/9 and 9/1 address leadership, the self and the public. [For more on IR sets and filters, consult *The King's Book of Numerology II: Forecasting – Part I*].

SECRET LOVE AFFAIRS

It is common knowledge that JFK engaged in continuous adulterous activity during his marriage to his wife, Jacqueline Kennedy. There is his pre-marital relationship and post-wedding affair with Gunilla von Post. Perhaps most famous is his relationship with Marilyn Monroe. Other women often connected to JFK are Judith Campbell, Mary Pinchot Meyer and Mimi Beardsley Alford. (Wikipedia)

Kennedy's chart clearly reveals the potential for such behavior in multiple places. First, the numbers forming his Basic Matrix Umbrella—his 7 Lifepath, 8 Expression and 6 Performance/Experience (PE) with its 33 master root reveal a red flag. Too, his quintset (set of five) of 33 energy throughout his chart is another. His 7/33-6 IR Sets occupying his Basic Matrix Umbrella, 1st Pinnacle, Grand Challenge and Crown Challenge are others. All of these numerical patterns create warning signals of untoward behavior, betrayal and potential adultery. While they may not guarantee it across the spectrum of relationships, they certainly indicate the potential of such behaviors.

The 7-8-6 Umbrella

The 7-8-6 energy pattern comprises Kennedy's Basic Matrix Umbrella. When the 7 Lifepath lessons of spiritual, ethical and moral testing, with its cloak of privacy and secrecy, filter through the 8 Expression of connection, interaction and involvement, the outcome reality is the 6 of personal love (or lust) and romance. When the 6 also has a 33 master root (signifying intense pleasure-seeking) attached to it (which it doesn't always have), the scenario is a recipe ripe for untoward and adulterous behavior.

JFK was not the first person beset with this 7-8-6 umbrella pattern, nor will he be the last. It is a dangerous combination *if* the person living it does not imbue the highest ideals of spirituality, ethical conduct and purity of behavior. One simple phrase for this set could be "secret love connections." Another phrase is "adulterous love." Yet another could be "romantic heartache," and still another, "family tragedy." All of these phrases fit this Basic Matrix Umbrella 7-8-6 pattern. While many factors in a chart have an influence on how the energies of this triumvirate are manifested, the potential for broken vows, broken homes, broken hearts and broken bonds of love are quite possible. Kennedy's life is a perfect example of how this specific pattern can affect a person's life. As a note, betrayals and untoward behavior are not limited to this 7-8-6 triset. It is just one of those patterns that carries an automatic red flag.

The 7/33-6 Grand & Crown Challenges

Kennedy's 3rd and 4th Challenges (Grand and Crown respectively) contain this same IR set associated with his umbrella, thus exacerbating and magnifying its power, creating a *stacking* of its energies. As we have learned, stacking creates intensity. Since this 7/33-6 pattern already exists in his Basic Matrix (in simple form as the 7-8-6 triset), having it also located in the Grand and Challenge positions of his chart is not a good sign. The Grand Challenge is the centermost core of his 7 Lifepath along with his 3/2 Grand Pinnacle, which is not as troublesome. Challenges in a chart usually reveal the most difficulty and they are generally hidden from view. As history bears witness, the extent of Kennedy's personal and family issues were not fully known until after his death.

The 33 Quintset

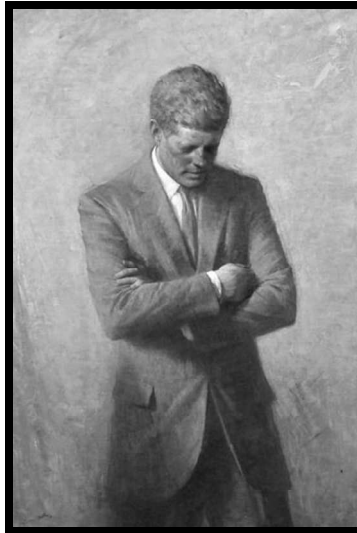
Creating more fuel to Kennedy's personal life was the quintset of 33 energy pervading his chart. It is located in the name "Kennedy," his Life Performance/Experience (PE), First Pinnacle PE, Grand Challenge PE and Crown Challenge PE. When a number, especially a master number, appears five times in a chart its effects—positive or negative—will be noticeable.

The 33 binary is known as the *Master Imaginator/Communicator* in The King's Numerologytm. Yes, it does have its sexual and sensual aspect but it also represents great ability to communicate with words, art,

voice, dance and so forth. Kennedy was an excellent speaker and many of his quotations have become solidified in the American political landscape. Perhaps his most iconic quotation is:

My fellow Americans, ask not what your country can do for you; ask what you can do for your country.

As we're seeing, the charts of our featured icons reveal multiple identical energy patterns, many of which are master numbers such as the 33. It is this amalgam of master power that helped create who and what they were or are. Master numbers are a dominant numerical framework of their destinies, destinies comprised of energies which are always dual in nature, intrinsically housing forces that are simultaneously positive and negative and which . . . for the wise individual . . . demand introspection and reflection.

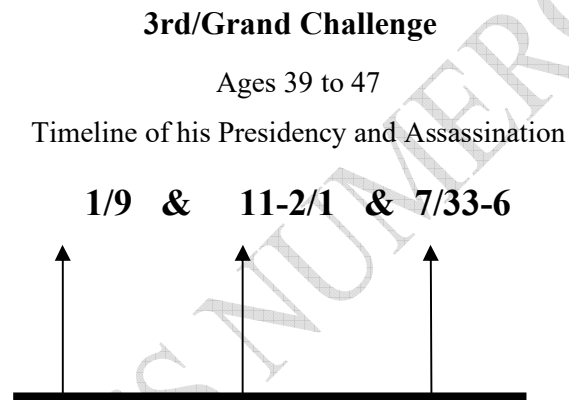

JFK's GRAND CHALLENGE CIPHER SET (ages 39 to 47)

The Grand Challenge is the core Challenge of a person's Lifepath. Normally, a person will have one or two Challenges. JFK's chart has three IR sets, an uncommon aspect but not unknown. In simple ciphers, the three IR sets contained within his Grand Challenge are: 1/9, 2/1 and 7/6. Because of their power and significance, when master numbers exist in a Challenge, they should be referenced. For example, an 11 is a 2 in reduction and all 11s therefore are 2s. However, all 2s are not necessarily 11s. 11 is 11, just as 33 is 33, even though it can be reduced to a crown (simple number) of 6.

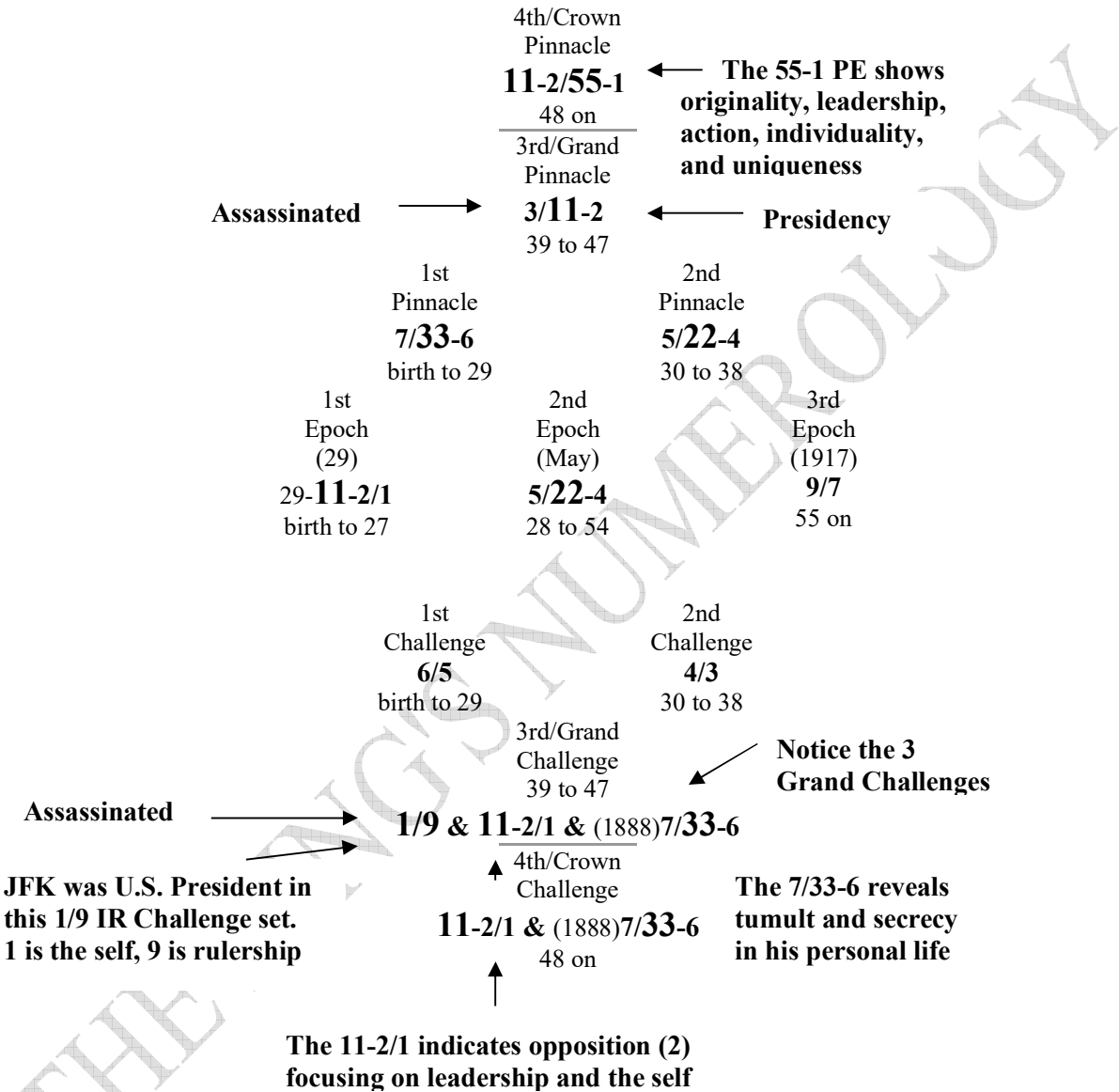
Kennedy's three IR sets in his Grand Challenge illustrate the complexity of his life during the period of his Presidency.

THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION

The assassination of JFK on 22 November 1963 was a remarkable event in American history—in many ways an unbelievable, horrific and unspeakably tragic drama. Arguably, the only other event of such magnitude in the late Twentieth and early Twenty-First Centuries would be the attack on the World Trade Center Towers on 11 September 2001, aka 9/11.

A Personal Note

I was a Sophomore in high school at the time of the JFK assassination. It was a Friday. I was walking from one class to another when I heard the news. It was pure shock. President Kennedy assassinated? How could this be? Everyone was stunned—students and teachers alike.

That entire weekend I was glued to our black and white television. Color TV did not exist then. There were no cordless phones, cell phones, computers or other personal communication devices in those days, those days of yore. Nor was there the type of everyday violence, tension, division and unease that exists today. It was a more innocent time but a time whose innocence was waning as the Cold War between the USA and the USSR was waxing. The Cuban Missile Crisis had just occurred a year earlier—an event that brought the world to the edge of nuclear war closer than it had ever been. But still there was a sense of innocence left. After all, it was a time of Camelot, of the handsome King (Jack) and his Queen (Jacqueline). Too, kids in my generation had never seen war, having been born after World War II.

Watching the news that weekend was a time neither I, nor those of my generation, will ever forget. For those who are still alive, it's a good bet every one of them knew exactly where they were when they received the shock that the President of the United States had been fatally shot. It was poignantly painful, just like 9/11 for this generation.

That weekend was eerie. The only major news channels—ABC, CBS and NBC were awash in images of men and women openly weeping in the streets, stunned in their grief. JFK was a popular, charismatic, articulate, beloved President. And now gone? It was numbingly surreal.

Sunday morning, 24 November, added more drama. I remember watching Lee Harvey Oswald, Kennedy's alleged assassin, being escorted by the police through the Dallas Police Headquarters and ultimately through its basement en route to the county jail when Jack Ruby, a Dallas night club owner, moved through the crowd (from right to left) and fatally shot Oswald at point blank range in the stomach. Shock! Another murder in real time on national television! Today, people only see clips of the shooting. For us who saw the event in real time and who are still alive, watching that murder unfold now is not just a clip of history, it was, for us at the time, history in the making.

Sunday's events did not terminate with Ruby's shooting of Oswald in the morning. In the afternoon, Kennedy's funeral cortège, with his flag-covered casket transported by a horse-drawn caisson poignantly accompanied by a riderless horse (Blackjack) with stirrups reversed to acknowledge a fallen warrior, proceeded from the White House along Pennsylvania Avenue to the Capitol Rotunda as multitudes of people lined the boulevard. Then, as his body lay in state, hundreds of thousands of people lined up outside the Capitol and patiently entered the building, filing past his coffin, paying their final respects. What I remember—which was quite nice but nonetheless eerie—was the silence of it all, that and the event's iconic images of his wife and daughter, Caroline, kneeling beside his coffin as Jacqueline kissed it. Then there was the image of his three year old son, John-John, saluting his father's casket after his funeral—truly gripping and sad moments. No public event that I have personally witnessed in my life can compare to the somber silence, sorrow, sadness, numbness, respect and reverence of that weekend.

Monday, 25 November, had been declared a national day of mourning by JFK's Vice-President and, in succession, President Lyndon B. Johnson. The funeral procession moved from the Capitol to the White House to St. Matthew's Cathedral and to Arlington National Cemetery where Kennedy was buried, his plot marked by an eternal flame. Millions of Americans watched the solemn, dignified and historic event on their black and white televisions.

To me, America was never the same after that, after the assassination of President Kennedy. Maybe it's because I was an impressionable young teenager, quite innocent and naïve as to the ways of the world. Still, that was the weekend America's innocence died, a country changed forever.

JFK—ASSASSINATION DATE NUMBERS

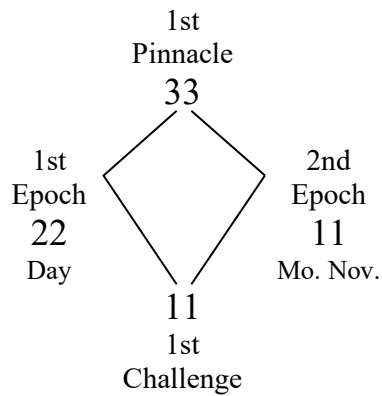
John Fitzgerald Kennedy was assassinated Friday, 22 November 1963. This is a very powerful day numerologically and there are correlations between it and John Kennedy's chart (following). Note the master number triangle formed by the day, month, 1st Pinnacle and 1st Challenge—all of which form a 77-14-5, a numerical pattern of loss.

Also of significance is the number 33 forming a tristack of the name "Kennedy," the 1st Pinnacle of the 22nd of November and JFK's Grand Challenge of a 7/33-6. Perhaps more noticeable is the hexstack of 7 energy associated with his assassination. As we've discussed, 7 is JFK's Lifepath—the lifepath housing the greatest potential for suffering, sorrow, tragedy, betrayal and tears.

SUMMARY

John Fitzgerald Kennedy was a juxtaposition of all that is noble and problematic in a leader. He had great charisma, charm, personal power. He was loved by many people, but as history would later discover, his personal involvements outside his marriage were a tarnish to his legacy. JFK's presidency was a true challenge, especially given the enormous changes in the global environment and the pressures intrinsic to them, such as the space race, the Civil Rights movement in America and the Cold War.

Kennedy's presidency, too, was a time of hope, courage, inspiration and a fairytale of Camelot. Sadly, it was also a time of great tragedy, tears, fears and suffering. How long-term history will judge JFK remains to be seen, but it was an unforgettable time with extreme highs and lows.

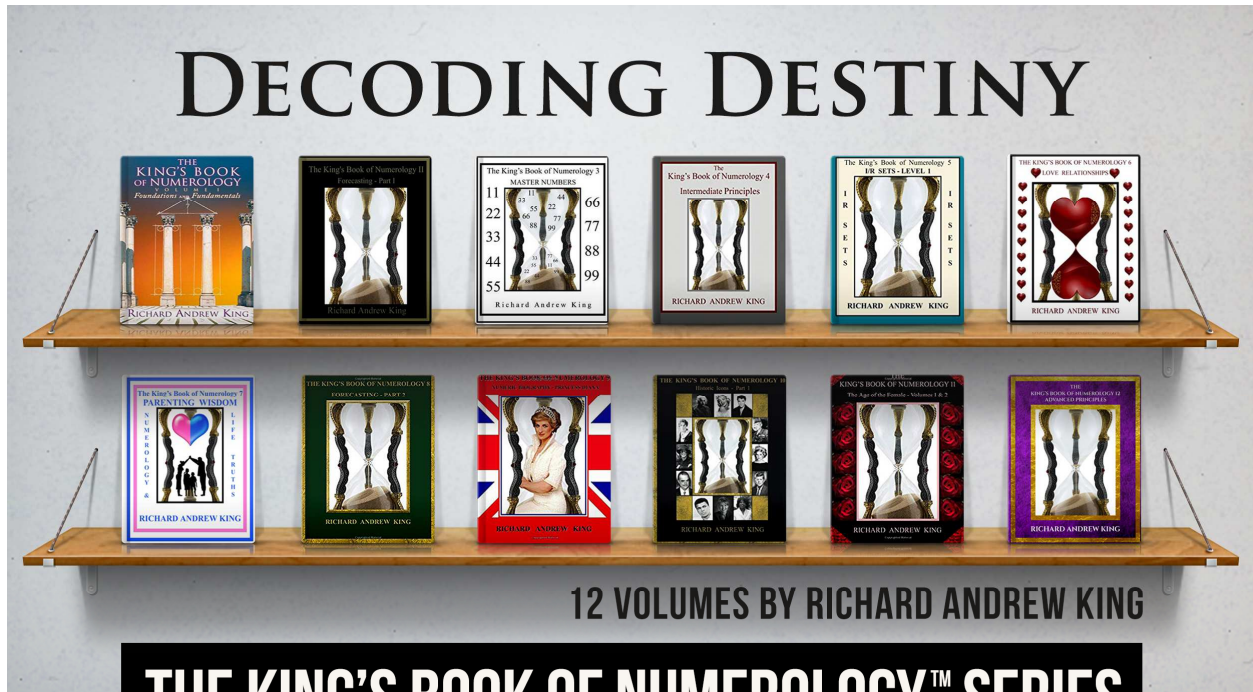
