## CHAPTER 12

### JIM JONES

~ CULT LEADER, MASS MURDERER ~

**JIM JONES** was not just a Bad Guy and a murderer. There are not enough pejorative adjectives in the English language to describe him. He was a self-centered, egomaniacal, evil, cruel, demented, diabolic,

vicious, usurious, sadistic monster who betrayed his own people, forcing them (adults and children alike) to perform mass suicide at Jonestown, Guyana, South America, on 18 November 1978.

Jones—a drug and sex addict—didn't love his followers, he used them to aggrandize his own image and identity. Rather than loving his “flock,” he betrayed them and forced them to commit mass suicide by drinking Flavor Aid laced with poisonous cyanide (not Kool Aid as has been erroneously reported). After the mass murder, Jones apparently committed suicide with a gunshot to his head. If such behavior—organizing the mass suicide of one's own followers who trusted him with their lives—is not Satanic behavior, what is? Jones was not just a wolf in sheep's clothing, he was a devil masquerading as a man of god.

Jim Jones was a con artist. He spread the concept of socialism and communism as being a paradise on earth where people would live together communally. Those who became members of his church, the Peoples Temple, were forced to donate their earnings and real estate deeds of ownership to him, which he used to build his own real estate empire.

For church members who got out of control, Jones would do humiliating things to them, including whipping and stripping them to being totally naked. His main purpose was to gain complete control over people who believed in him. This was not love, but usury.

Jim Jones was a thief who had no real concern for others. Disregarding Christian beliefs, he told his followers to see him as God. He even directed them to murder high-placed officials in order to promote a socialist society. Jones even had his followers spy on each other and report to him to test their loyalty to him. Jim Jones was a thug, a master manipulator and control freak. He even got to a point where he threatened to kill anyone who left his church. (Wikipedia).

In time, Jones became an addict, enslaved to drugs and sex. He became totally unhinged when he fled to Guyana and Jonestown, a settlement of approximately a thousand people. He trained his people to kill. He also told his people that they should die for him, which they ultimately did by drinking Flavor Aid—the purple liquid he laced with lethal cyanide.

When a few people from his congregation became concerned about Jones' behavior and abuse, they took their concerns to Congressman Leo Ryan. In order to see for himself what was going on at Jonestown, he

took congress woman Jackie Speier and a small entourage to Guyana to see what was happening. This was in November of 1978.

After Ryan and his group arrived at Jonestown, a reporter in their group was given slips of paper, in secret, saying some people wanted to leave. On 18 November 1978, a stand off occurred between those who wanted to leave and those who wanted to stay. When Congressman Ryan, Jackie Speier and others tried to leave, they were gunned down at a small air strip. Congressman Ryan died but Speier survived by playing dead.

That night, Jones called his “flock” to gather together. They were given the poisonous Flavor Aid laced cyanide, which Jones called a potion. He called for people lay down their lives. Some resisted. They were shot dead or forced to drink the poison. Jones demented last statement was:

*We didn't commit suicide. We committed an act of revolutionary suicide protesting the conditions of an inhumane world. (IMDB)*

That day, 18 November 1978, 909 people died (adults and children), victims of Jim Jones' lunacy, and, frankly, their own questionable lack of judgment in joining such a cult. A small handful of people did survive by hiding or escaping into the jungle. Finally, the demonic life and times of a treacherous Bad Guy, his arrogance and evil, came to an end.

### **BASIC MATRIX: NATAL NAME**

With such an evil legacy, what do Jim Jones' numbers say about him? They're very interesting.

Look at all those 5s! Lifepath is a 5; Soul is a 5; Material Soul is a Double 55-1 and Jones' Material Nature is a 55-1! Both the 5 and 1 are fire signs. The only number that is neither a 5 or 1 is the 6 which occupies the (PE) component and focuses on family.

This amalgam of 5 and 1 energy is dynamic. The 5 represents unbridled freedom, variety, the senses, adventure, detachment, motion, movement, exploration, and multiple experiences. The 5 loves speed. It also is a risk taker. A Lifepath of the 5 is one of constant change, detachment, variety, versatility, communication, free-spirited behavior, adventure, freedom, rebellion, uncertainty, and sensual experiences. The 5 is *the* Free Spirit of the Alpha Numeric Spectrum.

Two major issues of the 5 are: the need for constant stimulation and change. Constant stimulation can lead beyond freedom to enslavement—the opposite side of the 5 energy. Constant change can create a state of instability. Jones' massive 5 energy caused him to be continually unstable and unceasingly stimulated. He couldn't be any other way.

The 5 is also the *Number of Man* because we humans have 5 fingers, 5 toes, 32 teeth (a 5 in reduction), and are governed by 5 senses—sight, sound, touch, taste and smell. There are also 365 days in a year (365 reduces to a 5) and, interestingly, there are 5 rings on the Olympic flag. Thus, the 5 energy in his Basic Matrix allowed Jones to mix well with all people regardless of color. He was not perceived as a racist, which gave him credibility among the less fortunate.

However, the huge amount of 5 energy made him crave new adventures and sexual liaisons with his flock. He was the epitome of being drugged out, unstable and unpredictable.

Also of noted interest is that the Common Name “Jim Jones” is a also a 5 with a 14 Transition root, 32 General root; 95 Specific root. This common name generates an IR Set of 5/(5)/1 (32 General root of “Jim Jones,” plus 23 General Lifepath root = 5/(5)/1). This generated more problematic energy for Jones and, with the 5s in his Basic Matrix, created a Decastack (10 stack) of 5 energy. This is one of the main reasons Jones was so unstable, erratic, and out of control. Too much of a good thing may not be a good thing at all.

And then there's the 1 energy which created a Quintstack (5) of 5 energy—1 Lifepath, a double 1 Material Soul, a 1 Material Nature and a 1 ROPE of his Common Name IR Set.

This massive amalgam of the 5 and 1 energy was more than Jim Jones could handle. It would have been difficult for anyone to have what he had. It's all about the element of fire (1 and 5 are both fire signs), freedom, adventure, stimulation, motion, adventure and sensual experiences, coupled with the 1 energy of self, ego, arrogance, leadership, action and identity. Simply put, Jim Jones was a wild fire that couldn't be extinguished.

This saturation of 5 and 1 energy was obviously at the core of Jones' problem and ultimate demise. He simply was not anchored enough to not fall prey to this dynamite 5-1 paring.

## **THE 6 PERFORMANCE/EXPERIENCE**

As previously noted, the only other number in Jones' Basic Matrix besides the 5 and 1 is the number 6, which manifests as his Performance Experience (PE) component. A 6 PE tells us that "family" is important to Jones. It's not voided, so that must mean that Jones' role in life was to be a loving, nurturing, responsible soul who cares deeply for his family, right? Not so fast. Let's look deeper.

"Family" was important to Jim Jones but his history is clear that he could be very abusive to the "family members" of the Peoples Temple. Plus, Temple members were required to fork over the deeds to their property or contribute monetarily to Jones. This is not the way of an individual who loves his family members. It's actually what communist countries always do to their citizens—confiscate their wealth and property and make them slaves to the totalitarian state for the "betterment" of all. It's such a scam. No. Jones was not a truly loving leader. Here's why. Read on.

The Specific root of Jones' 6 PE is a 222v. This tells us that he does not truly care for others at all. A positive 2 energy governs close personal relationships and is tender, caring and supportive of all the individuals in those relationships.

A negative or voided 2 energy is one that has no true and deep concern for others. The 222v of Jones' 6 PE can also be ciphered as 2v2v2v. This structure reveals the true essence of Jim Jones' 6 PE. Jones was a con artist who pretended to care for "family" but in actuality he could care less. He needed people to care for him, to recognize his ego and submit to his power and leadership. As we have seen in the charts of other Bad Guys, a single 2 void reveals a distinct lack of caring for others. What does this reveal about a 2v2v2v trimaster energy and the manifestation of its negativity? Answer: it tells us that Jim Jones could

care less about his “flock.” He only cared about himself. His orchestrated mass murder suicide, which he mandated for his “flock,” tells us the truth of the real Jim Jones.

**VOIDS: 2-3-7-8** (Ciphred as: 2v—3v—7v—8v)

It’s not surprising that Jim Jones’ natal Basic Matrix reveals four voids, especially when it only contains 5s, 1s and a 6. The amount of 5s and 1s, along with the 2v, 3v, 7v and 8v, reveal that Jim Jones was a very imbalanced individual.

The 2v has been discussed a lot in this 13<sup>th</sup> Volume of the King’s Book of Numerology<sup>tm</sup>. It shows us that very often a 2v can be dangerously problematic in human relationships. Simply stated, a 2v generally doesn’t care about others, and when juxtaposed to a chart like that of Jim Jones with all of its ego-centered 1 energy, it can indeed be concerning. Simply, the 2v doesn’t care about others; the 1 cares only for itself, and the more 1 energy present in a chart, the more precarious human relationships can be.

The 3 energy focuses on communication, words, happiness, joy, children, image and images, health and well-being, sex, art of all kinds and positivity. A 3v forms a cloud over the 3’s energy of joy, happiness and communication. For example, a normal 3 energy exudes smiles and a joyful countenance. With a 3v energy dominant in a chart, the person is seldom joyful, happy, positive or fun. It doesn’t mean a person can’t be productive, but it does mean that being and expressing a happy, fulfilled and positive attitude are rare.

Jim Jones’ 3v is a good example of someone who can be communicative but not a happy camper. The speech of a 3v individual can be angry, abusive, acerbic, caustic, negative and just plain fun-less and joyless. It’s pretty clear that the 3v identifies Jim Jones. The man was filled with negativity and a warped sense of what it is to be joyful and happy. He talked a lot, which is not uncommon for 3v individuals, but it is common for them to not be happy, joyful and positive. After all, where is the positive demeanor and joy in being responsible for the deaths of 909 people—adults and children alike? Answer: There is none except for the demonic, hellish, infernal and wicked.

The 7 void (7v) often manifests as a lack of discretion, good judgment, clarity of thought, introspection, analysis, study. When one studies the life of Jim Jones, it is clear he made some really bad choices and a lot of them. Denigrating Christianity in a Judeo-Christian country was a main blunder. Promoting a socialist/communist ideology in America was also a huge No-No. Forcing himself sexually on members

(females and males) of his Temple was another. Telling people of his flock to call him God and ordering his security guards to kill United States Congressman Leo Ryan and his entourage was yet another in a long list of bad choices, choices which led to his ultimate demise.

The 8 void (8v) involves a lack of connectivity, organization, orchestration, management and involvement. Jones was so consumed with his own ego and power he could never be, and never was, a good leader and manager of the Peoples Temple and of Jonestown. Of course, he was the boss and what he said was the law, but as far as establishing a social utopia he was a failure, as anybody would be. Great generals, for example, are concerned with the safety, well-being and survival of the troops under their command. Jim Jones could care less about those under his jurisdiction. Superficially, yes; substantively, no. If he were concerned, he would never have stolen their money and real estate deeds of ownership. He would never have humiliated them publicly, had sex with other men’s wives and, most tragically, orchestrated the deaths of all those souls who believed in him. Those poor 909 souls, whom Jones murdered, believed in him but the feeling was not mutual. Jim Jones was a heartless killer of souls—the very souls who trusted him to protect and care for them. Tragic, simply tragic.

**BASIC MATRIX: COMMON NAME**

It’s always interesting to study the Common Name Basic Matrix of a person to get as full a picture as possible. Therefore, let’s see what the Basic Matrix of “Jim Jones” tells us about this very Bad Guy.

The first thing that pops out is Jones’ 5/(5)/55-1 Umbrella—5 Lifepath, 5 Exp, and 1 PE with a 55 General root. Jones’ natal Basic Matrix was telling enough but more 5 and 1 energy, even with a 55 master General PE root, puts a second layer of icing on the cake of Jones’ dark, sensuous and self-absorbed life. This is yet more proof of Jim Jones’ self-centered, egomaniacal, narcissism.

Next, look at his voids! They're the same as his natal name: 2v, 3v, 7v, and 8v. The dramatic reality here is that each one of the voids is a component of his Common Name Basic Matrix! As we see, Jones has an 11-2v Soul; a 7v Material Soul (MS); a 66-3v Nature and a 44-8v Material Nature! This is craziness and very, very rare, indeed.

The 11-2v in Jones' Soul confirms that he really could care less about others on a personal level.

His 7v Material Soul addresses his failed sense of intelligent assessment and thought.

The 66-3v Nature speaks to his sexual misconduct. The 66-3 by itself is extremely sexual but since the 3 is voided it generates an element of darkness and misuse of sexual energy—as in having sex with other men's wives, even sex with men. It also includes misuse of drugs and helps explain Jones' addiction to them.

Interestingly, the 66 master energy also shows up in Jones' Specific Inclusion, aka, House of Letters. It is anchored in the 5<sup>th</sup> House and generates 35% of the Specific Inclusion. The 5<sup>th</sup> House is all about freedom, variety, sensuality, excitement, adventure and change. This definitely speaks to Jones' sexual adventures and proclivities, stacking with his 66-3v Nature.

Jones' 8v Material Nature confirms his inability to truly and honestly connect and engage with others in a positive manner. Plus, this 8v carries with it a 44 root, further proving his lack of effective and noteworthy leadership. The 44-8v definitely puts him in charge but the void renders him less than great.

This process of comparing both the Natal Basic Matrix and the Common Name Basic Matrix is an excellent way to dig deeper into someone's overall being. It should always be considered in a thorough chart analysis, especially if the Natal Basic Matrix leaves one with questions about its outcome and explanation. These two Basic Matrices of Jim Jones—Natal Name and Common Name—are proof that the process of dual analysis works.

Jim Jones' Life Matrix reveals two important Influence/Reality Sets. The first one, which creates life linkage, is the 1/(1)/2v IR Set. The second is the 9/(1)/1 IR Set. Both speak to ego, self and power.

Life Linkage of the 1/(1)/2v IR Set is visible in the 1<sup>st</sup> Challenge; 2<sup>nd</sup> Pinnacle; 3<sup>rd</sup> Pinnacle (Grand); 3<sup>rd</sup> Grand Challenge and 4<sup>th</sup> Crown Challenge. An excellent word string for this life-long energy is: *self/(self)/others* with the "others" being voided.

Another word string could be *leader/(leader)/followers* with "followers" being voided. This life linkage pattern of 1/(1)/2v tells the story that Jones' life was all about him and his power while there was little to no real support of the "others" in his life. "Self before others" is a simple phrase of this 1/(1)/2v IR Set. If the 2 were not voided, a word string could be *self/(self)/service* to others. It's the void of the 2 that is the critical factor.

The other major Influence Reality Set in Jones' Life Matrix is the 9/(1)/1 which occupies his 1<sup>st</sup> Pinnacle, 2<sup>nd</sup> Challenge, and 4<sup>th</sup> Pinnacle (Crown). This pattern is steeped in two things: power and ego. A suitable word string is *power/(ego)/ego*. Another word string could be *throne/(self)/self*. Yet another could be *dominance/(arrogance)/arrogance*.

The 9/(1)/1 IR Set is extremely powerful and dangerous because it is, indeed, all about one's power, ego and arrogance. If handled well, it can be extremely positive. If not handled well, it can be perilously negative. The latter is the more likely scenario.

Without question, the 9/(1)/1 IR Set is a test to see if the person who has it in their chart acts with benevolence, grace and dignity as a true leader or if the individual acts with malevolence, arrogance and dictatorial tyranny.

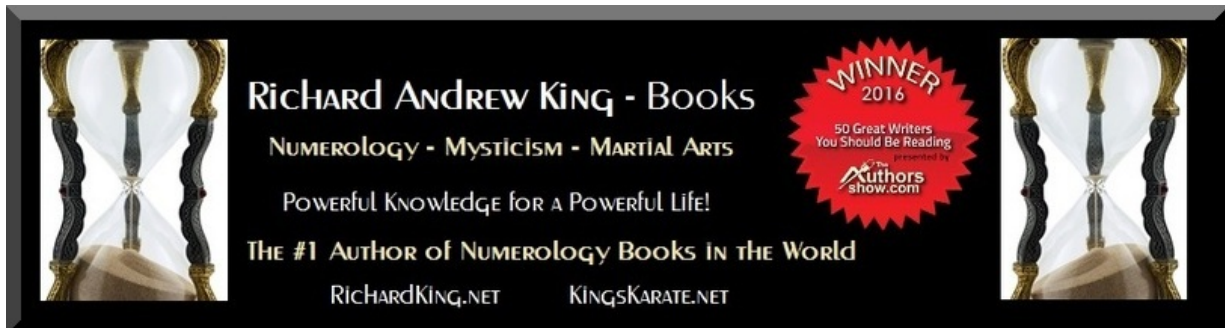
Power can be a great temptation and lethal Siren Song. It's really easy to be a tyrant. It's really difficult to be a humble and gracious leader. And since we live in a creation based and governed by Karmic Law, a person with this 9/(1)/1 energy pattern would be ever wise to think deeply and make wise choices because what we put onto the circle and cycle of life will, without question, come circling and cycling back to us, eventually.

Jim Jones was a Bad Guy. The massive amount of 5 and 1 energy, along with the voided quatrain of the 2v, 3v, 7v and 8v were extremely problematic. In the end, it was Jones' lack of control due to his 5s and his power driven ego of the 9 and 1 that caused him to murder the 909 souls who, sadly, put their trust in him to protect and guide them to paradise.
